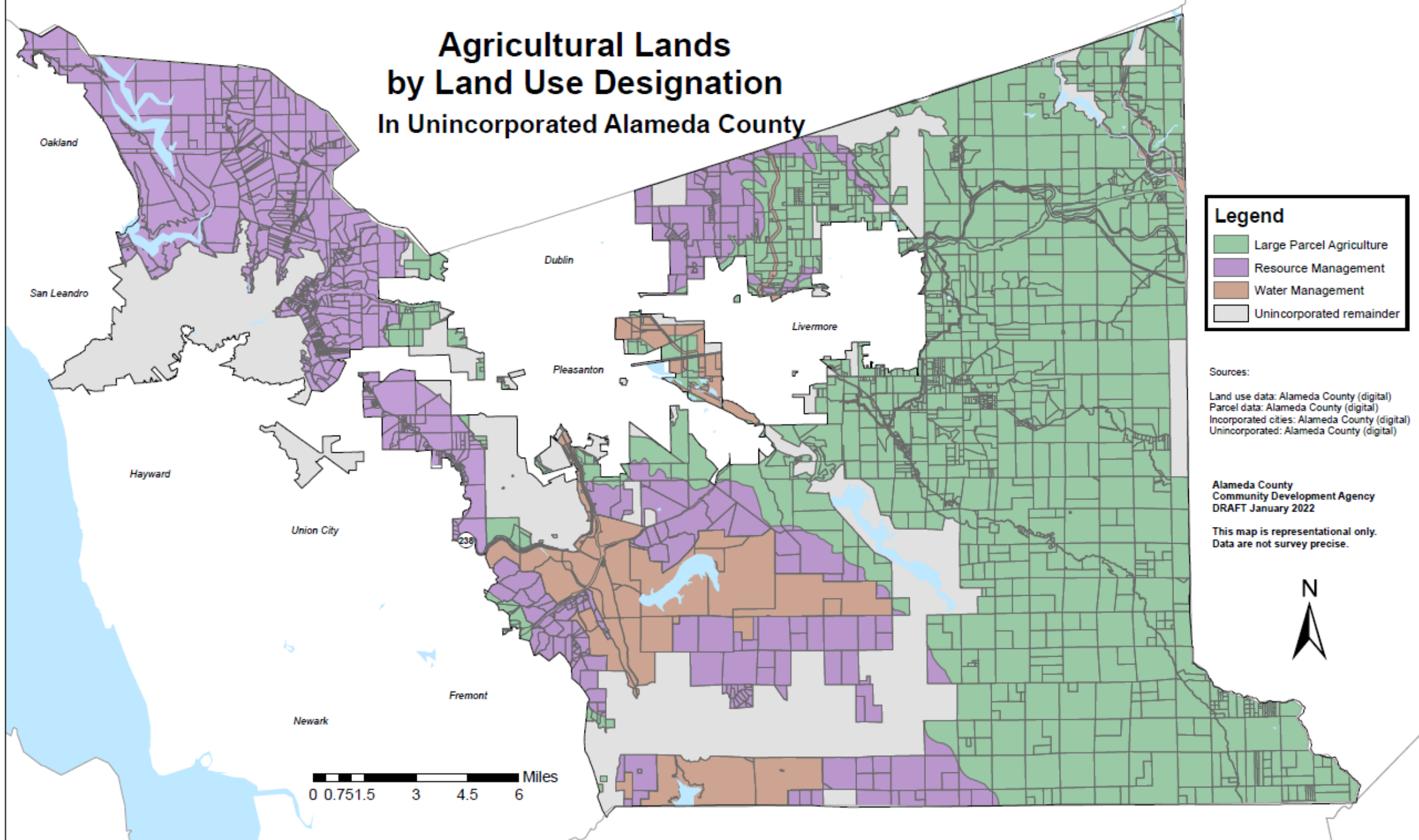
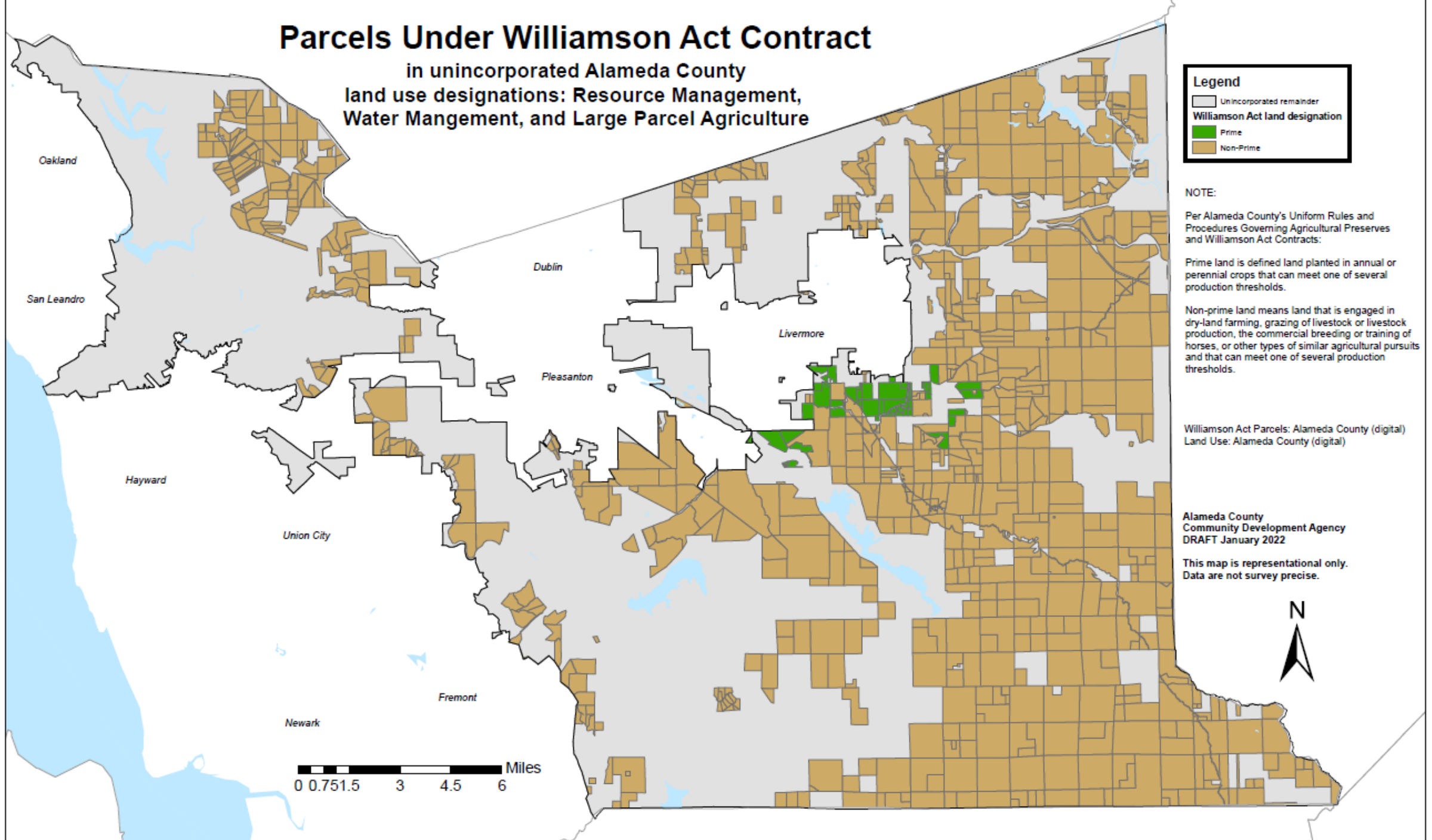


Agricultural Lands by Land Use Designation In Unincorporated Alameda County

Per Alameda County's Uniform Rules and Procedures Governing Agricultural Preserves and Williamson Act Contracts:

Prime land is defined land planted in annual or perennial crops that can meet one of several production thresholds.

Non-prime land means land that is engaged in dry-land farming, grazing of livestock or livestock production, the commercial breeding or training of horses, or other types of similar agricultural pursuits and that can meet one of several production thresholds.

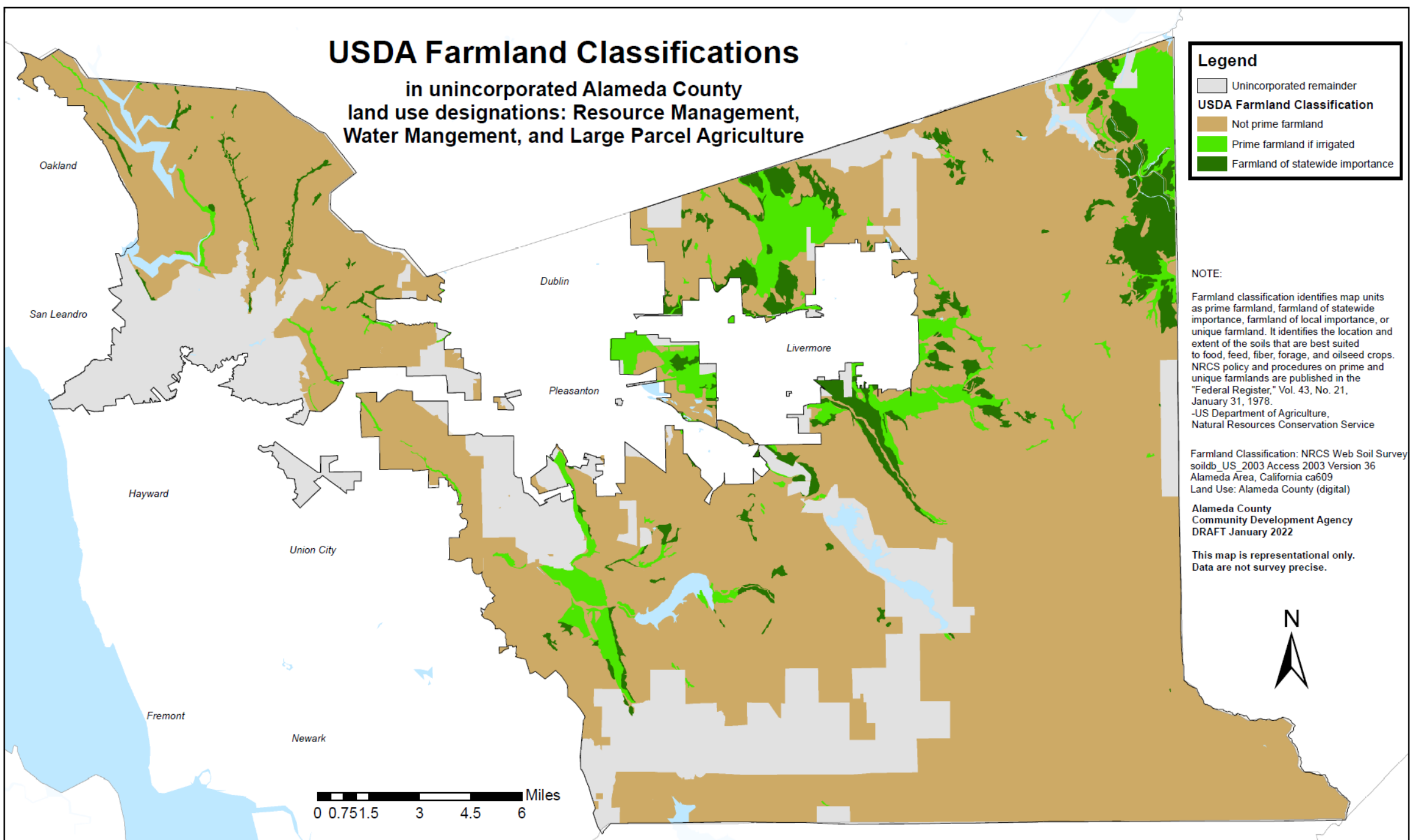

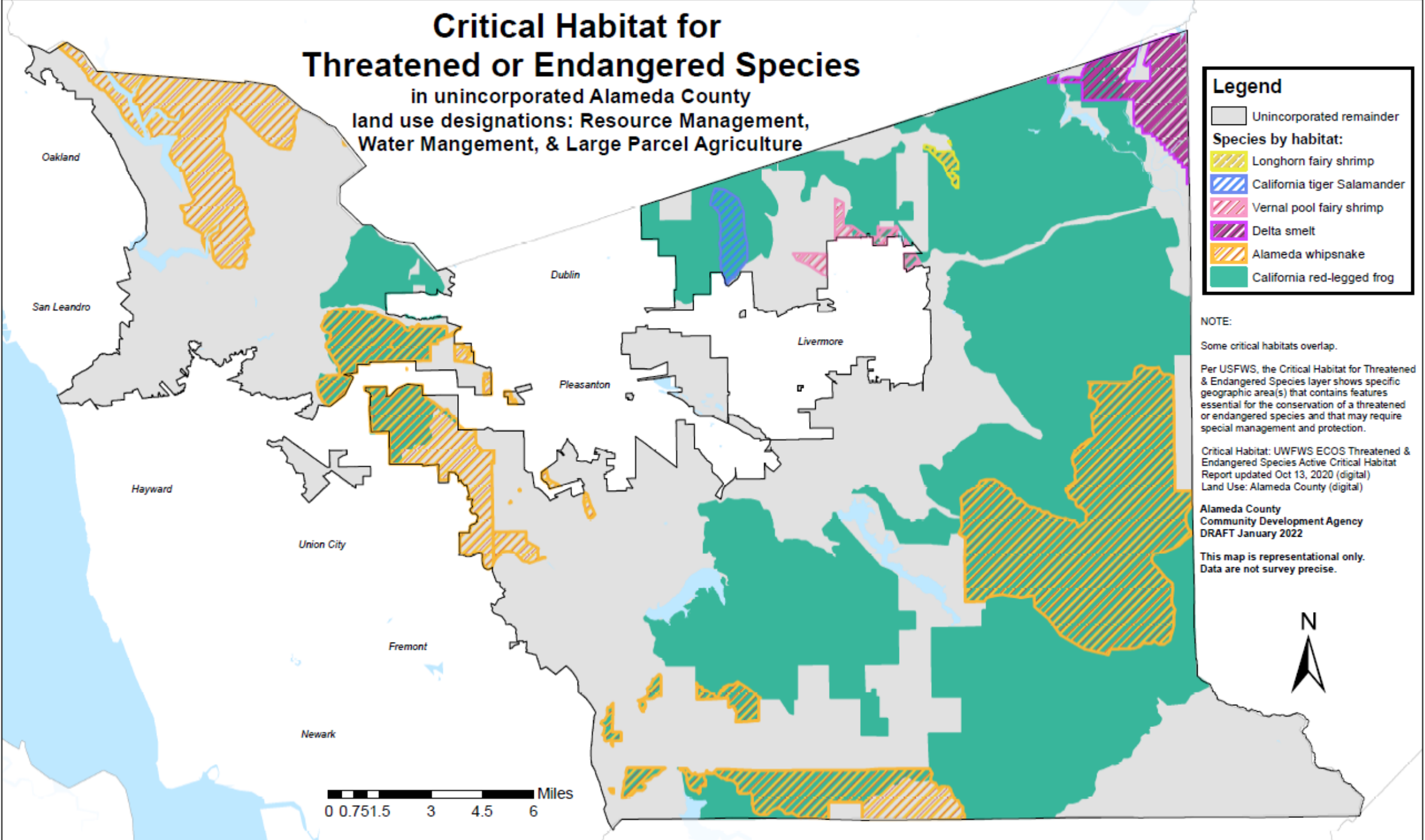
USDA Farmland Classifications
