II. Announcements & Updates

- A. Oversight Committee Membership Updates
 - In December, the Board of Supervisors approved the appointment of Art Chen, Alameda-Contra Costa Medical Association (Seat No. 9), Fran David, City Managers' Association (Seat No. 12), and Suzanne Barba, League of Women Voters (Seat No. 2).
 - Kay Eisenhower, Supervisor Nate Miley (Seat No. 16), submitted her resignation letter to Supervisor Miley and Measure A staff. HCSA will deliver a card, a certificate of acknowledgment and thank you gift to Kay following the meeting. We want to acknowledge Kay's many years of service and commitment to Alameda County and the Oversight Committee. Staff will report to Committee when Supervisor Miley has selected someone to fill the seat.
 - Terry Sandoval's current term is scheduled to expire at the end of March. HCSA Staff is working with Terry and the Central Labor Council for her reappointment (Seat No. 7).
- B. Statement of Economic Interests Form 700 (handout)

 - HCSA is finalizing the financial information, the Report will next be sent to the Chairperson for final approval.
- B. Meeting Minutes from November 22, 2013
 - Al Murray motioned to approve the minutes. Fran David seconded the motion, there were no abstentions. The motion passed. It is noted that Art Chen requested the November minutes include a capital discussion under Future Meeting.

IV. Update: Finance/Budget

- A. Measure A Revenue Received to Date (handout)
 - Total revenue for FY 13/14 to date is ~\$12.9 M for Alameda County (not including allocation for Alameda Health System dba Alameda County Medical Center).
 - Approximately \$51.7 M in Measure A funding has been received in the first five months of Fiscal Year 13/14.
 - HCSA will provide the Measure A Reserve policy and amount currently in savings at the next meeting.
- B. Review of Board Letters for Measure A One-Time Allocations (see Appendix A)
 - James reviewed one-time allocations.
 - HCSA will provide additional information regarding the Community Initiative fiscal sponsor.
- C. Recent Board-Approved Contracts funded by Measure A (see Appendix A)
 - James reviewed Board-approved contracts.
- D. Measure A Blue Ribbon Task Force Update
 - Louis Chicoine and Terry Sandoval provided updates from the December 4 Measure A Blue Ribbon Task Force Meeting. Supervisor Miley is currently campaigning to raise \$250K. They are aiming for this to be on the June 2014 ballot. Details around the reauthorization of this measure are in progress.

V. DISCUSSION: Measure A Capital Expenditures

- James provided a presentation of the history of use of Measure A funding for capital expenditures. There are numerous prior year contracts that use Measure A funding for capital expenditure. HCSA will work with County Counsel to develop language for future contracts to ensure that the facilities that are being built and renovated with Measure A funds will continue to be used to provide essential health care services for a specific period of time (amortize the amount of Measure A funding). James will also meet with other departments to see how they address this situation.
- The Committee requested HCSA to look at capital development expenditures to assess ways we can
 ensure reasonable sustainability of service delivery relying on amortize depreciation schedule as a
 base to determine to continuation of services in those facility.
 - Art Chen motioned to approve, Al Murray seconded, Suzanne Barba opposes. The motion passed.
- The Committee requested HCSA to take a sample of past years capital allocations to determine if providers are still using capital expenditures and providing services in the same way as the original Measure A contract. In addition, they also request HCSA to provide percentages of capital expenditures through the years based on the presentation today.
- The Committee will provide recommendations to the Board of Supervisors.
