# Notes for Measure A Report on FY 05/06 and 06/07 Expenditures

#### **Medicare Part D**

- General discussion followed by subsections for Alameda Health Consortium and Alameda County Behavioral Health Care Services (BHCS);
- Explanation of the allocation of the \$250,000 between Alameda Health Consortium and BHCS, including how much was expended and remaining balance;
- Highlight that the issue of Medicare coverage of pharmaceuticals for those on Medicaid was a national problem and recognition of Alameda County's efforts to address and bridge the funding gap for people in the County affected by the problem (Adele will help write);
- Small amount of funding that was able to help many
- Specific to BHCS, highlight the flexibility it has in spending the funding for mental health clients (Brad)

## **Capital**

- General discussion followed by subsections for Capital RFP and Other Capital Projects;
- Explanation of how funds were available from FY 04/05 savings (including Board policy on capital);
- Recognize that the Capital RFP allowed for flexibility in how money was spent;
- Point out that not many opportunities exist for capital funding for health providers
- Explain that Measure A funds must be supplemented with other funds for larger projects (match or leveraged), especially for health providers who provide services to a wider network of clients (uninsured, indigent as well as insured or paying patients)

# Administration and Infrastructure Support

- Explanation of why Administration and Infrastructure Support was not budgeted in FY 05/06;
- Highlight that a relatively small amount of funding is going towards administration;
- Highlight work of Oversight Committee as in-kind volunteer hours

### **Other**
